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Introduction

A two-round survey conducted last November and December by the Internet strategies department of LifeWay Christian Resources found that modern families struggle with a variety of issues ranging from an anti-Christian culture to materialism. In November 2005, the Internet strategies department of LifeWay, an entity of the Southern Baptist Convention, began soliciting participation in the Top 10 Issues Facing Today's Family online research project. From the initial list of responses, LifeWay compiled the 20 most frequently submitted answers and sent that list to the original survey respondents. During January, those participants used the same Internet survey tool to rank their top 10 from among those 20 issues.

LifeWay began revealing the results of the survey in early March with the announcement of materialism as the No. 10 issue. Each week, the Internet strategies department unveiled another topic in ascending order along with an extensive list of resources and information addressing that issue. Ministry areas throughout LifeWay are offering materials such as articles, movie clips, dramas, Web sites, sermons, Scripture passages and illustrations intended to aid ministry leaders in helping others or directly assist families facing the problems.

“This was an opportunity to put forward the best our organization has to offer related to the top issues as identified by the survey participants,” said Michael Epps Utley, marketing coordinator in Internet strategies. “LifeWay exists to provide biblical solutions for life, and this survey gave us some additional insight into the solutions people are looking for in order to address key challenges among their families.”

“Some of the survey results proved somewhat surprising,” Utley said. For instance, it was expected that substance abuse would rank in the top 10. Instead, unexpected issues such as busyness (No. 3) and lack of communication (No. 7) received a majority of votes.

Overall, more than 2,000 people from around the country offered their opinions in the survey, making this survey pool even larger than the one that contributed to last year's Top 10 Issues Facing Today's Church research project.





10 Materialism

Families throughout the developed world are subjected to an unceasing flow of advertising, image-making, and plain old selling of consumer goods and services. And... we are buying it. While the freedom to make consumer choices depends on this open market, the high pressure to buy more has other effects. These include consumer debt, lack of savings, and overextended parents.

Much of this commercial pressure is applied to reaching “decision makers” and “purchase influencers” as young as age two. Even mature consumers are falling prey to the trap of consumption that outstrips earning power or even earning potential. Feeding this fire are the seemingly unlimited offers of consumer credit sent through the mail and over the airwaves.

In a “stuff” -oriented culture, the Gospel is drowned out. We listen to our own insecurities and greed rather than finding fulfillment in Jesus Christ alone. A life of peace with God's provision is lost.

Rampant consumption also levies direct costs; families trapped in the race to satisfy wants and desires fall prey to financial stress, dissatisfaction, and bitterness.

The number 10 topic facing today's family, as expressed by individuals from a range of backgrounds, is “Materialism.”

“We suffer from Affluenza in this country – we have so much, and kids are learning to want more and more and more, without assessing the true value of “things” in life, or the fact that so many do without.”

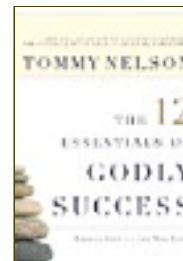

8 Negative Media Influences

7 Lack of Communication

“The near elimination of meaningful family member interaction.”

Cell phones, email, text messaging, instant messaging... there are more ways than ever to stay in touch. But family communication continues to be a challenge. Combined with the forces of increased levels of activities and more and more options for entertainment, time together to ‘just talk’ ebbs further.

These growing influences do not limit the amount of communication necessarily, but change the type of interaction that occurs. Rather than long stretches of time together in which issues have time to bubble to the surface, families have more perfunctory exchanges of planning for times and places.

Instant access to children by cell phone offers a feeling of safety, but furthers the freedom to spend time among friends over family. Music players and game consoles further isolate boys to a personal soundspace or their rooms while young girls are spending hours at a time chatting online and forming virtual relationships at great risk.

The number 7 topic facing today's family, as expressed by individuals from a range of backgrounds, is “Lack of Communication.”

“Cell phones, the Internet, digital satellite systems, and play stations are becoming substitutes for relationships. Families can not communicate effectively because of text messaging or using a cell phone talking to some one rather than being with the person in physical proximity.”

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2 Divorce

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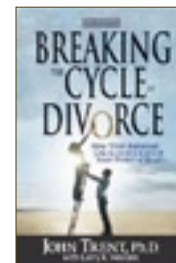

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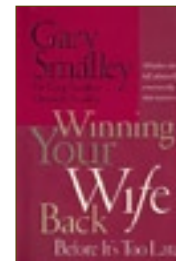

Removing ‘Christ’ from Christmas, banning references to the 10 Commandments, outlawing public prayer... there seems to be a lot of resistance to acknowledgment of the sovereignty of God.

Why is the culture so sensitive to faith? Has a purely materialistic view of the universe become so dominant that matters of belief cannot be tolerated in public?

What principles of behavior and right dealing can serve as universal values in place of the Christian Gospel? Is a culture that enshrines absolute freedom and radical individualism safe from itself? The answer is not known, but one thing is certain... if we continue on this path, it will be.

The number 1 topic facing today’s family, as expressed by individuals from a range of backgrounds, is “Anti-Christian Culture.”

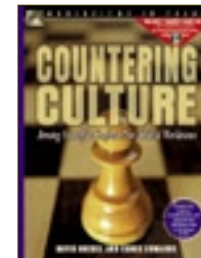
